In March, our charity raised and donated £500 to The British Red Cross Earthquake Appeal who were providing humanitarian relief, assisting with search and rescue and providing food and blankets (Joint Effort from Red Cross and Red Crescent) to people affected by the powerful 7.8 and 7.5 magnitude Turkiye-Syria Earthquakes. The combined death toll neared 10,000 with thousands injured; an estimated 23 million people were impacted, homes destroyed, and infrastructure badly damaged.



In July 2023, Aashiana members presented a cheque in the sum of £5000.00 to the Heart and Lung Centre, The Royal Wolverhampton NHS Trust New Cross Hospital. They were warmly welcomed by Consultant Mr Stephen Billing and hospital charity and fundraising team. They expressed their appreciation to all Aashiana members for the generous donation. The Heart and Lung Centre is a local success story which has consistently received good reviews and positive headlines to give it a national presence.





On 23rd August, we received a letter of appreciation from Head Teacher Mrs Georgina Wilford of World's End Infant and Nursery School. Aashiana donated £1400.00 for curriculum enrichment events. Do you remember touching a reptile or holding mini-beasts at school? The children had visits from the Animal Man and Animal Lady so they could see first hand about creatures that they referred to in science lessons. The money also funded an author visit by the energetic children's author and illustrator Paul Geraghty who delivered inspirational workshops to encourage reading, writing, drawing and creative thinking.

In August 2023, we visited Coombs Wood Cricket Club in Halesowen. Charity members got to see (and sit on) the five benches with commemorative plaques that we donated and also watched grassroots cricket in action, where we also helped fund new kit for the youth teams to practice and play.





In September, Aashiana had the great opportunity to help lots of children who have not had the best start in life, with many having been homeless and not knowing their parents. The charity sponsored and contributed towards each child's two uniforms, two shoes, two socks, one sweater and school bag to needy children.



In September, Aashiana sponsored a freezer to Shree Bhadrakali Mandir, Shekhupur, Punjab, to help them to store cold in the summer months for the hundreds of people the mandir feeds.





Aashiana proudly sponsored Quarry Bank Tennis Club Open Tournament in September 2023. It was a keenly contested adult competition for men's singles, ladies singles, doubles and mixed doubles. Trophies were officially presented again at the club's Annual Function in November 2023. 
